Kevin Dowd is an economist and formerly professor of financial risk management at Nottingham University Business School.

He has current or past affiliations with the Cato Institute (Washington), the Cobden Centre, the Independent Institute (Oakland, CA), the Institute of Economic Affairs (London), the Libertarian Alliance (London) and the Pensions Institute (London).

His research interests cover monetary, financial and macroeconomics, free banking and financial regulation, financial risk management, risk disclosure, political economy, longevity and pensions, and the current financial crisis.

Professor Dowd has published widely in academic and practitioner journals and is the author of a number of books, including

Measuring Market Risk (Wiley, 2nd edition 2005) and, most recently, with Martin Hutchinson,

Alchemists of Loss: How Modern Finance and Government Intervention Crashed the Financial System (Wiley, 2010)."
